DEHRADUN: Chief minister Pushkar Singh Dhami on Tuesday inaugurated development projects worth ₹46.2 crore in Kashipur in Udhm Singh Nagar.

Dhami was addressing the State-Level Urban Development Conference held in Kashipur as part of the state's silver jubilee celebrations. During the event, he also flagged off 14 garbage collection vehicles for the city.

"The soul of a state resides in its villages, while the dreams and aspirations of its citizens take shape in its cities," Dhami said.

"With this vision, we have placed urban development at the centre of our priorities. Today, our cities are making steady progress in sanitation, road infrastructure and public welfare," he added.

Dhami added that a new sewerage treatment plant and a modern solid waste management facility were also being established in Kashipur. The city will also benefit from an Industrial Hub Project worth ₹1,100 crore and an Aroma Park Project worth ₹100 crore, the chief minister added.

Oppn targets govt over 'lapses' in infra works, law and order

DEHRADUN: The second day of the special two-day assembly session convened to mark the silver jubilee of statehood saw the opposition highlight alleged lapses in the state's public infrastructure, law and order and healthcare, among other issues.

Mamta Rakesh, Congress MLA from Bhagwanpur slammed the law-and-order situation in the state, citing the murder of a 28-year-old man in Dehradun on Monday.

Independent MLA from Khanpur Umesh Kumar said that the assembly must hold a discussion on the failures of the past 25 years. He referred to issues such as corruption, examination paper leaks, and alleged commissions.

The state is reeling under debt amounting to ₹1 lakh crore, he said.

He added that the health infrastructure was in disarray, and women were forced to give birth either at hospital doorsteps

or en route to medical facilities.

Congress MLA from Badrinath Lakshpat Butola said the government must work to preserve the very identity of Uttarakhand, and a proposal should now be sent to the Centre to ensure fair representation of hilly areas.

The number of voters in the hills was declining while it kept rising in the plains, he said.

He said hill districts faced continuous neglect, and people struggled for drinking water and basic facilities.

He also attacked the government for "erosion of cultural values" through the introduction of

the provision of live-in-relation-ship registration under Uniform Civil Code (UCC).

He also highlighted the issue of migration and said nearly 1,700 villages were now deserted.

He also raised concerns over rising wildlife-human conflicts, stating that several people have been killed recently in his constituency alone.

Leader of Opposition and Bajpur MLA Yashpal Arya raised the issue of poor health infrastructure in hills, referring to the ongoing protest in Chaukhutia (Almora) for lack of facilities at CHC there.

Congress MLA from Piran Kaliyar said atrocities against minorities have increased under the BJP government, while the budget allocated for their welfare schemes has been reduced.

He accused the government of indulging in politics of religion, adding that Muslim religious sites were being targeted.

He said farmers too were suffering as sugarcane dues had not been paid and the government's promise of doubling farmers'

income remained unfulfilled. He questioned why the price of sugarcane had not been increased for so many years.

Independent MLA from Yamunotri, Sanjay Dobhal also attacked the administration, saying that migration out of the state continued due to gaps in health, education, and employment opportunities, and the situation on the ground remains largely unchanged.

He said that dozens of villages in the Yamunotri region are still deprived of proper road connectivity.

Meanwhile, BJP MLAs defended the current administration and emphasised their commitment towards the state's future.

BJP MLA from Rishikesh Prem Chand Aggarwal said while former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee laid the foundation of Uttarakhand, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is shaping the state's future.

He also mentioned Char Dham projects and under construction Rishikesh-Karna-

prayag rail line as achievements of the BJP government.

He said the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) introduced in Uttarakhand received widespread appreciation across the country.

He said the state received the first prize from NITI Aayog for its performance, and among Himalayan states, Uttarakhand secured the second position in financial parameters.

BJP MLA from Karnaprayag Anil Nautiyal said that many historic initiatives have been carried out by the BJP government in the last eight years.

He mentioned all weather road, under construction Rishikesh-Karnaprayag rail line and announcement of ropeways for Kedarnath, Hemkund Sahib as achievements of the BJP government.

Nautiyal said the government also introduced several "historic laws" including anti conversation, strict land laws as well as an anti-rioting law. He said a 'Sainya' Dham as fifth Dham is being constructed in Dehradun to dedicate to the armed forces.

Protest march from Chaukhatia stopped near Rispana bridge

DEHRADUN: The ongoing protest march over the demand of improved health facilities in Chaukhatia in Almora district was stopped by police near Rispana bridge during an attempt to reach the state assembly on Tuesday, police officers familiar with the matter said.

The march had begun on October 24, seeking a comprehensive healthcare policy to strengthen healthcare facilities, especially in the hilly areas of the state.

The protest is an extension of the "Operation Swasthya" agitation, which began on October 2 in Chaukhutia, led by former soldier Bhuvan Kathayat.

Following the agitation, the state government on October 16 announced the upgradation of Chaukhutia Community Health Centre (CHC) into a 50-bed sub-district hospital (SDH). Protesters, however, called the move "incomplete", vowing to continue their struggle.

According to Kathayat, "We have peacefully undertaken over 300 km of padyatra from Chaukhatia to Dehradun. Unfortunately, no one from the

government has come to hear our demands. But we will not give up until our demands are fulfilled."

Meanwhile, Congress MLAs also raised the issue in the assembly.

Leader of Opposition Yashpal Arya said, "There is a 'police raj' in Dehradun... they (protestors) were lathi-charged... this is a people's movement. The norms of the CHC are not being fulfilled."

Responding to him, state parliamentary affairs minister Subodh Uniyal claimed that the agitation was politically motivated.

"For politics, innocent people are being misled," sai the minister.

CTR guide barred from reserve land over 'deer meat' video: Officials

HALDWANI: A man employed as a nature guide at Corbett Tiger Reserve (CTR) was banned from reserve territory after a purported video clip uploaded by a Chandigarh-based tourist on social media showed him making comments on the taste of deer meat prompted the initiation of a detailed enquiry. Forest officials said on Tuesday, adding that the probe was ongoing.

According to officials, the controversy began after tourist Ratan Dhillion shared a post on X, wherein he described a gypsy safari accompanied by other tourists.

He alleged that the assigned nature guide slept through much of the ride and, upon waking, chewed tobacco and threw the packet into the forest. When the tourists objected, they reportedly had to pick up the litter themselves, alleged Dhillion, who also claimed that instead of sharing insights about Corbett's biodiversity, the guide casually began talking about the "delicious" taste of deer meat.

According to CTR director Dr Saket Badola, the guide was identified and barred from entering the reserve pending the outcome of an internal enquiry. "The warden has been asked to conduct a thorough investigation," Dr Badola said.

Man booked for culpable homicide over death of 38-year-old in Doon

DEHRADUN: A 34-year-old man was arrested on Tuesday and charged with culpable homicide over the death of a 38-year-old man on Monday after an argument between him and the accused escalated into a physical scuffle, police said on Tuesday. The deceased was identified as Arun Kumar alias DK, said police, adding that he met the accused, identified as Ajay Kishore Devli, in the evening in front of a salon at Sahaspur in the city, wherein the two subsequently entered into an alleged argument.

Senior superintendent of police (SSP) Ajai Singh said,

the scene had confirmed this sequence of events.

The body was recovered later in the evening, said Singh, adding that it was sent for post-mortem examination, which found no marks of external injury suggesting a direct assault on the deceased. "The post-mortem report will provide further clarity," he added.

"Both men knew each other, and had been involved in a financial dispute," added the SSP.

Based on a complaint filed by the wife of the deceased on Monday, a case was registered at Premnagar police station under section 105 (punishment for culpable homicide not amounting to murder) of the BNS, said police.
